Instructions

1. Admission processes of Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) will be conducted through the **SAMARTH e-Gov** web-portal of the Department of Education, Government of Assam.
2. From the subjects included in the **Core Subjects**, students are required to select three subjects of their choice as Core Subjects. However, students should check the **Prerequisites, Requirements** and **Constraints**.
3. There is no limitations on the choice of three Core Subjects in Arts Stream or Science Stream but Science students can give priority to **Physical Science/ Biological Science/ Earth Science** and Arts students can give priority to **MIL/ Other Language/ Social Science**.
4. Of the three subjects selected as Core Subjects, one will be converted to **Major** and the other two to **Minor** in the third semester.
5. If seats are exhausted on the date of admission in the subject requested as **First Core Subject** through SAMARTH e-Gov Suite, students will have to take only the subject of their second or third choice as First Core Subject.
6. In the case of **Common Course**, students have to choose **VAC, MDC, AEC, SEC**. There is no alternative here.
7. Students who wish to take admission into the GU-FYUGP, either through an affiliated college or through **FYUGP@GUCampus**, must be registered with the **Academic Bank of Credit (ABC)** and must obtain the 12-digit **ABC-ID** through the Digilocker platform. GU shall require the ABC-ID of each and every student admitted into GU-FYUGP either at the time of Registration or at the time of Downloading of Admit Card for the First Semester examination.
8. Students can contact the college authority, concerned coordinators or college professors Dr. Jugabrat Das (9864723497), Dr. Hemanta Deka (9957201559) and Dr. Santosh Kumar Mishra (9435024665) for assistance regarding admission.

12. Location of the College : The College is situated at the heart of Goalpara Town, the District Headquarter of Goalpara District & on the south bank of the Brahmaputra river.

Brief History of Goalpara College

On August 8, 1955, the then-visionaries of western Assam founded a college in the historic town of Goalpara on the south bank of Brahmaputra in an approximately 35.28-acre expanse of lush green land with the noble intention of catering the requirements of higher education of the aspiring youths of the peripheral area. Under the leadership of freedom fighter, first MLA of Goalpara Khagendranath Nath and eminent educationist Wazuddin Ahmed the Arts stream flourished rapidly and eventually in 1965, the Science stream was introduced. During the journey the college produced a galaxy of prolific alumni who have been contributing in different parts of the world. In 2015, the much-awaited Commerce stream was added to the oldest college of the region. With three streams having both honours and regular courses the college has been attracting thousands of students from various parts of the state including Meghalaya and West Bengal. The twice NAAC assessed, ISO 9001:2015 certified college participates in NIRF ranking. It offers 18 programs and has a student-strength of 2346. There are 73 members of teaching staff and 37 employees.

The gender sensitive, divyang friendly, green campus of the college developed state-of-the-art infrastructure for teaching learning with 34 ICT enabled classrooms, 8 smart classrooms, advanced Biotech Hub, GIS laboratory, sophisticated language laboratory, 3 computer laboratories, Community Radio Station (CRS) and a fully digital library. Besides, it has a playground, courts for badminton, volleyball and basketball, sophisticated gymnasium, three hostels and two canteens. Goalpara College has three centres of distance learning CDOE-GU, KKSHOU, CDOE-Tezpur University which offer degree and diploma courses in both UG and PG programs. Goalpara College has concluded series of MoU and collaborated with different institutions and agencies for student-teachers exchange and forenhancing research capability. College has been receiving grants from UGC, DBT, DST, ICPR and other agencies for advanced research and development. With ever changing academic and technological change the College is scaling up itself. Medium of Instruction

HIGHER SECONDARY COURSE

This is a vital part of academic activities in the college of Assam, though it is not included in the academic activities defined by the U.G.C.

The Higher Secondary (H.S.) course under Assam Higher Secondary Education Council is of two year duration. At the end of the first year, there will be an examination conducted by the College. After successful completion of the said examination, a student is allowed to appear in the H.S. Final examination at the end of the Second Year.

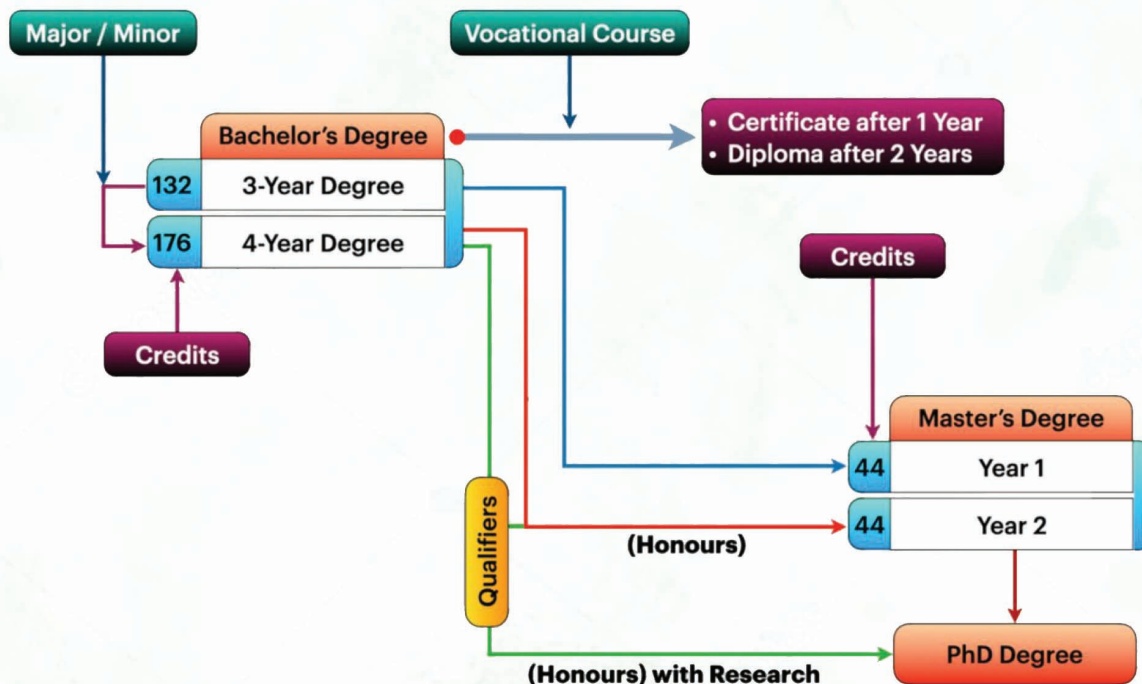
FYUGP Structure under NEP

Goalpara College, Goalpara
Affiliated to Gauhati University

Introduction:

- The **Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)** of Gauhati University is as per UGC's Curricular Framework, published in November 2022.
- The course structure of FYUGP is built on the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS).
- Though, the FYUGP is basically a CBCS, it is radically different from the courses running under CBCS. Namely, it does not differentiate between so-called *Honours* and *Pass courses* existing under CBCS. Basically, the FYUGP is based on the system of education under *Liberal Arts*.

Progression:



FYUGP Degrees and Course Structures:

- The FYUGP at GU is designed to offer **two types** of Bachelor's Degrees to the students at the end of the successful completion of the programme-
 - (i) Bachelor's Degree in a Stream and
 - (ii) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline.

The word stream here refers to Arts, Science, Commerce and Management. In case of a degree in a stream, the student studies a multitude of different subjects, usually mixing different disciplines, which leads to a truly multidisciplinary degree.

While in case of a degree in a discipline, the student is confined to a certain sets of disciplines. However, in both cases, the student studies equal number of courses (i.e. papers) so there is no weightage of any kind to either of the two types of degrees.

- For both the types of degree programmes, course-wise, the whole FYUGP is divided into two parts-
 - (i) Core Courses and
 - (ii) Common Courses.

Core Courses:

- (i) Major and
- (ii) Minor

Common Courses:

- (i) Multi-disciplinary Course (MDC)- Sem I, Sem II and Sem III
- (ii) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)- Sem I, Sem II, Sem V and Sem VI
- (iii) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)- Sem I, Sem II and Sem III
- (iv) Value Added Course (VAC)- Sem I, Sem II and Sem IV
- (v) Internship (INT)- during Sem III to Sem VI

The Fourth Year

- In the FYUGP, the fourth year is at par with the first year or a Master's programme, as a student can directly take admission into the second year of a Master's programme after the successful completion of the FYUGP.
- In the fourth year, a student has to complete one **compulsory paper** on Research Methodology (REM) in the Semester VII, which is a 4-credit theory

paper. The rest of courses will consist of Advanced Core Courses and a Dissertation.

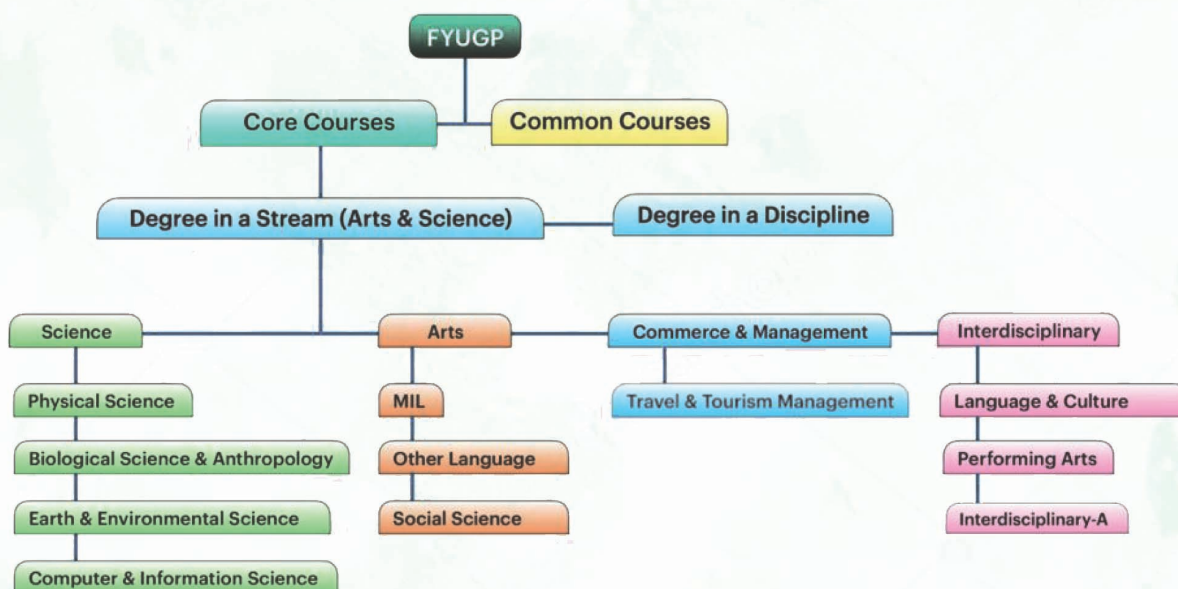

FACILITIES AVAILABLE IN THE COLLEGE

ABOUT LIBRARY :

Goalpara College library is fully automated with Integrated Library Management Software (ILMS) SOUL 3.0 software from INFLIBNET Centre, Gandhinagar, Gujarat. Also, library is using D Space Content Management Digital Library software for digitization of documents.

It is the hub of the academic activities supporting the institutions mission of achieving excellence in education. The Central library of Goalpara College includes a large reading room, a reference section and two computer rooms with internet facilities. The library with its open access system and spacious reading area provides an atmosphere conducive to the excitement of mental discovery. The library also provides access to e-resources to the teachers and students of the college through N-LIST programme of INFLIBNET Centre. For smooth functioning of Library and its activities, college constitutes a Library Management Committee.

The library at present has a collection of 37170+ printed books (textbook and reference) comprising Arts, Science and Commerce subjects and has subscription of 19 journals, 14 popular magazines and 10 numbers of national and regional newspapers. The library also provides access to e-resources through N-LIST which is a part of e-Shodh Sindhu consortium of INFLIBNET centre. The users can access 1, 99,500+ e-books and 6000+ e-journals from the N-LIST database. The library is a registered club member of NDLI. The users can access 6, 00,000 e-books through NDLI.

Besides providing Issue-Return facility with Bar-coding system, the library also provides Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) to the users. The Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) facility helps the users to track the books easily. Presently, Web OPAC has also been installed for convenience of the library users. The Barcode technology is used for circulation. It facilitates library circulation with increased accuracy and efficiency. Moreover, the college library provides reprographic facilities also. Users can also avail free internet service with Wi-Fi facility in the library. The library also has a rich reference section consisting of department wise reference books. A student can avail the library, reading room and reference room facilities at any time during the working hours of the college.

The library has a separate webpage (<http://www.goalparacollege.ac.in/library.php>) which provides all the information of the library. The electronic version of selected library resources can be accessed through the specially designed digital library portal available at <http://117.211.77.131:8080/jspui/>. The library has developed its own Institutional Repository (IR) using D-Space software, which is an open access electronic archive for collecting, preserving and distributing digital materials. To record footfall of the users the library has introduced digital attendance system integrated with SOUL management software. The library holdings also include dissertations, doctoral theses, Major and Minor Research Project reports and back volumes of journals/magazines and newspapers. The library has a collection of 45 out of print rare books of social and historical relevance which are kept separately in the Reference Section. Library has a UN/UNESCO Reading corner, which has been enriched through study materials obtained from United Nations Resource Centre-NE Region, Guwahati. The library has a question bank facility where the End semester examination question papers are collected and stored (print and digital) for the students and faculty. The library provides Xerox facility to the students at a nominal cost. It has installed fire safety units and eight CCTV cameras to ensure optimum surveillance. Anti-Plagiarism software Plagiarism Checker X Professional is available in the library for research purposes thereby ensuring students' academic integrity.

Learning Management System (LMS)

A Learning Management System (LMS) is embedded with the website where class PPTs, notes, video lectures, seminars, participative e-learning materials etc. are stored for easy access for the students. The college has a FM Community Radio Station integrated with the LMS portal to facilitate online learning.

STUDENTS' AID FUND :

Financial assistance is granted to the poor students out of the students' aid fund. Such grants are given to the poor and meritorious students on the basis of their application to the principal and subject to the availability of fund.

SCHOLARSHIPS/AWARDS :

Moziruddin Ahmed Memorial Scholarship is instituted from the last year by the donation given by Kamrul Hasan and Dr. Moshrafuddin Ahmed. A sum of Rs. 3 Lakhs has been donated for this purpose. In every year four scholarship will be given to four meritorious students which will be as follows -

- (i) Student securing highest aggregate marks in Higher Secondary Final Examination in both Arts and Science.
- (ii) Student securing highest aggregate marks in TDC Final Examination in both Arts and Science.

BEPIN CH. GHOSE (TEACHER) MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP :

- (i) One scholarship will be awarded to the students securing higher aggregate marks in the 1st year TDC examination (2nd semester result) in both Arts and Science.
- (ii) One scholarship will be awarded to the students securing higher aggregate marks in the 2nd year TDC examination (4th semester result) in both Arts and Science. The amount of scholarship will be Rs. 500/- (five hundred) for each scholarship holders. Moreover deserving students can enjoy the benefits of various Central and State Government Scholarship such as National Merit Scholarship, State Merit Scholarship, Scholarships to Char area students and ITDP sponsored SC/ST/OBC/MOBC Scholarships.

Apart from the above scholarships, the college offers following aids and supports. (i) Waiving of full tuition fee for one year for those students who secure first position in the 1st year H.S. and TDC-I (Total score of 1st and 2nd semester), TDC-II (total score of 3rd and 4th semester) for major students in both faculties of Arts & Science in every year.

KKHSOU STUDY CENTRE :

Students who have passed 10+2 stage or Bachelor Preparatory Programme (BPP) of KKHSOU are eligible for admission in the above courses. If a student successfully completes his B.A./B.Com/BCA/BBA/B.Sc course with one or two additional degree, diploma or certificate from KKHSOU, his qualification and bargaining power in the job market will be enhanced. From the last two years KKHSOU, is conducting the Primary Teachers' Training Programme (Diploma in Elementary Education). RULES AND REGULATIONS

IDENTITY CARD AND COLLEGE UNIFORM :

A nontransferable identity card is issued to each student at the time of admission for a period of one year. All students of the college shall have to wear College Uniforms prescribed by the college authority.

ATTENDANCE OF STUDENTS :

A student must attend at least 75% of the lectures delivered in each subject to become eligible for appearing in the University or Council Examinations. The scholarship holders must attend atleast 80% of the lectures delivered in each subject for the renewal of their scholarships. (i) Major students will have to be closely associated with the respective academic organizations available in the college. (ii) Change in combination/major can be made with proper permission from the principal within 30 (thirty) days of admission to the concerned class.

COLLEGE TRANSFER CERTIFICATE :

If a student wants to leave the college, an application to the principal for issue of transfer certificate is to be submitted with clearance from the following :

- (i) College office.
- (ii) College library.
- (iii) Head of the department concerned in case of science students.
- (iv) N.C.C. officer in case of N.C.C. cadets.
- (v) Superintendent of the hostel concerned in case of hostel boarders.

HOSTEL RULES :

The boarders of the hostels must abide by the rules and regulations set up for the management of the hostels. Violation of these rules and regulations shall be treated as a cause for stringent punitive action which may include expulsion from the hostels as well as from the college. Boarders are allowed to meet their visitors only on designated days and at a designated time.

MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE :

Every student will have to behave properly and maintain discipline inside and outside the college to uphold the prestige of the institution. No student is allowed to take the law into his/her own hand. The properties of the college must be preserved and protected by every student. The students of Goalpara College irrespective of caste, religion and language are expected to behave in such a way as if they are the members of a single family. **Ragging in any form is a punishable offence.** Moreover, students are to note the following seriously- Use of totacco and tobacco products including any form of Gutkha is strictly prohibited within the college campus and anybody found violating the above shall be severely punished. Use of cell phones, within the college campus, class rooms and examination halls are strictly prohibited, the violation of which shall attract severe disciplinary action. Any act of bullying, using obscene language, using any form of intoxicants, public display of affection, insulting teaching and non-teaching staff, violation of hostel rules, parking of vehicles here and there, damaging college property, tarnishing college displays, throwing plastic or polythene bags etc will attract disciplinary action including fine against the errant students.

LIBRARY RULES :

Following rules and regulations are in force that must be followed while visiting and using the library:

Admission to the Library

All members of the Goalpara College shall be allowed admission to the library.

Entrance inside the Library

To entrance inside the library maintain the following instructions

- (a) Every student must come to the library with college uniform
- (b) All personal belongings except wallet, mobile phone, note book and library Borrower's Card will have to deposit in the property counter.
- (c) Every user must scan his/her library Borrower's Card on the scanner machine for digital library attendance.

Membership

The following categories of persons shall become members of the Goalpara College Library:
 All the faculty members of Goalpara College.
 All the regular students and
 All other regular employees of Goalpara College.

Rules of Lending of Books

Each member will have a Library Borrower's Card according to the category to which he/she belongs to.

Students can issue books for 15(fifteen) days only. A fine as per Library rules will be charged for each volume kept beyond the due date. No fine policy is applicable for Faculty members and Non-teaching staff.

The Library Borrower's Card is not transferable.

Periodicals (journals, magazines and newspapers) and books from Reference Section are not issued.

Books lost, torn or defected in any way have to be replaced/ paid by the borrower.

The librarian may recall any book from member at any time.

A Library Clearance Certificate may be issued to members only on returning all books borrowed and surrendering the Library Borrower's Card.

Procedure for Borrowing Books

The members shall be privileged to borrow the specific number of books from the library according to their category.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL(IQAC)

To ensure continuous all- round improvement of the college, IQAC was constituted in 2004 after the first NAAC accreditation of the institution. The IQAC is continuously working towards the fulfilment of Vision and Mission of the college. Because of the relentless and untiring endeavour of IQAC, the college was accredited by NAAC in 2010 and now the college has submitted the Self Study Report (SSR) and preparing for the next accreditation. IQAC reviews all processes viz. teaching-learning, methodologies, institutional operations by holding meetings periodically. Learning Management System (LMS) is amplified for excellent delivery of educational courses. Transformation of traditional classrooms into ICT-enabled classrooms to access both basic and advanced technologies necessary for skill expansion is prioritized and efforts are made to achieve the same.

Self-Enhancement Workshops are organised periodically to improve work ethics, data management and stress management skills of staff. 'Deeksharambh'-induction programme and NEP-2020 related activities are latest steps incorporated by IQAC in educational planning. Add-on courses, seminars, workshops and international webinars are conducted to create better opportunities for multidisciplinary learning.

Course implementation by Bloom's Taxonomy, mapping of Course Outcome, Programme Outcome and Programme Specific Outcome are addressed by IQAC at department level. IQAC has conducted holistic audits including Green Audit, Energy Audit and Gender Audit to enhance environmental consciousness and responsibility. 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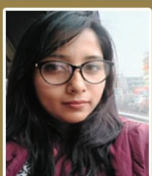
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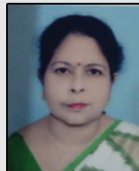


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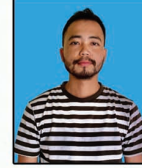
